HOUSEHOLD RECYCLABLES



PAPER

- magazines, junk mail, catalogs, phone books
- paper, paper bags, mixed paper, envelopes, shredded strips of paper **(NO CONFETTI)**
- newspaper (anything that comes in the newspaper), wrapping paper **(NO FOIL OR RIBBON)**
- flattened corrugated cardboard **(NO WAXED CARDBOARD)**
- cereal, cracker, soda & beer cartons, paper egg cartons, paper towel tubes



PLASTIC

REMOVE CAPS/LIDS & RINSE CLEAN

- plastic bottles, tubs (6 oz or larger)
- rigid plastic containers (such as yogurt and margarine tubs)
- rigid plastic plant pots (4" or larger)
- plastic buckets (5 gal or less)
- plastic milk jugs

TIN & ALUMINUM

REMOVE CAPS/LIDS & RINSE CLEAN

- cans (attached lids), labels okay
- foil, pie tins & trays
- beverage cans

WHEN IN DOUBT, LEAVE IT OUT.

CITY RECYCLE ONLY:

GLASS

RINSE CLEAN
LABELS ARE OKAY

- clear, colored glass bottles & jars only
- use only the small glass bin

MOTOR OIL

- Pour into a leak-proof, unbreakable, container (1 gal max.) with screw top lid.
- Clearly label outside "motor oil"
- Place outside of and next to small glass bin

RECYCLING TIPS

- **PLASTIC BAGS** are not recyclable at the curb. Please recycle at participating grocery stores. Visit PlasticFilmRecycling.org for more information.
- **RIGID** plastic clamshells, hard plastics from produce or bakery items are not acceptable in your recycle. Please dispose as trash.
- **STYROFOAM** is not recyclable. Please bag before disposing as trash. Most mailing services will accept clean, bagged Styrofoam peanuts.
- **GLASS** - no dishes, glasses, ceramics or window glass. Never put glass inside the Blue Roll Cart. Rural customers can recycle glass at recycle depots.



Bottles or jugs used to contain motor oil, pesticides, herbicides or other hazardous materials **CANNOT BE RECYCLED.**
